

Course Summary

The "Video Editing Essentials" course is designed for aspiring editors looking to gain practical skills in video post-production. Covering industry-standard software and tools, the course guides learners from foundational concepts to advanced techniques like color grading, motion graphics, multicam editing, and portfolio building. he course introduces students to the complete video editing workflow — from importing footage to delivering polished content. Topics include editing theory, timeline work, audio mixing, visual effects, storytelling through B-roll, chroma keying, and exporting for multiple platforms. The curriculum emphasizes hands-on practice and creative development.

Objective

- Understand core concepts of video editing, including editing types, software tools, and workflow structure.
- Develop hands-on proficiency with editing techniques such as cutting, transitions, layering, and audio balancing.
- Enhance visual storytelling through B-roll, text overlays, color grading, and motion graphics.
- Master export settings for different platforms, ensuring optimal quality and compatibility.
- Build a personal portfolio project, demonstrating complete video production skills from import to final export.

Completion Criteria

After fulfilling all of the following criteria, the student will be deemed to have finished the Module:

- Attend at least 90% of classes and practical workshops.
- Complete weekly editing exercises and practice projects with a minimum 80% proficiency.
- Successfully complete and present a final edited video project (2–3 minutes) demonstrating learned techniques.
- Active participation in group critiques and feedback sessions.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Navigate and utilize major video editing software interfaces efficiently.
- Organize media and manage project settings including frame rate and resolution.
- Apply essential editing techniques like cutting, trimming, transitions, and layering audio.
- Edit using B-roll, create visual narratives, and manage sync between audio and visuals.
- Enhance videos with color correction, grading, and visual effects.
- Create and use motion graphics, including animated text and lower thirds.
- Export video projects in suitable formats for various platforms (e.g., YouTube, Instagram).
